Doreen Fryling, Ed.D. (Nassau Concert Choir) is in her 29th year as a public school music educator. She currently teaches IB Music and chorus classes at South Side High School in Rockville Centre, NY, and has previously taught K-5 general music and middle school chorus. She teaches graduate courses in music education at Hofstra University in philosophy, research, and curriculum and instruction. Doreen is an active and founding member of the eVoco Voice Collective and served for 8 years on the board as the Special Projects Chair. Doreen has a Doctorate of Education in Learning and Teaching from Hofstra University. Her dissertation is on the psychological and sociological factors that influence persistence in choral singing. She also holds degrees from Susquehanna University and the University of Michigan. In 2015 Doreen was recognized as a semifinalist for the Grammy Music Educator Award. She has been published several times on the NAFME Music in a Minuet Blog and featured in their Member Spotlight Interviews. Doreen currently serves as President of NY-ACDA. Doreen shares her love of music making with her husband, David, and their two children.

Craig B. Knapp (Nassau Treble Choir) is the current Elementary Music Department Chairperson in the Rocky Point School District where he has been teaching Classroom Music and Chorus, grades 3 through 5, at the Joseph A. Edgar Intermediate School since 1998. A graduate of the Crane School of Music, Mr. Knapp has also studied with distinguished educators and musicians including John Feierabend, Jos Wuytack, Henry Leck, Francisco Núñez, Janet Galván, Will Schmid and Bobby McFerrin. Craig is an Adjunct Assistant Professor at Hofstra University where he teaches "Conversational Solfege" and "First Steps in Music with Orff Schulwerk." He is the co-author of the book, *First Steps in Music with Orff Schulwerk: Sing, Say, Dance, Play* and a contributing author for the book, *Feierabend Fundamentals: History, Philosophy, and Practice*. Craig is a sought-after clinician and choral conductor and has guest conducted for the Connecticut Music Educators' Association Elementary Honors Choir, New Hampshire Music Educators' Association Elementary Honors Choir, Ohio Music Educators' Association Elementary All-State Choir, KONY (Kodály Organization of New York) "Voices United" Festival and Pennsylvania Music Educators' Association Elementary ChorusFest. He has also guest conducted various All-County chorus groups in New York State for the Dutchess, Monroe, Nassau, Orange, Putnam, Rockland, Schoharie, Suffolk, Ulster and Westchester County Music Educators' Associations. Craig is actively involved with NYSSMA (New York State School Music Association), where he recently served on their Curriculum Committee and NYSSMA Manual Committee. Craig is the only educator to simultaneously hold Lifetime Memberships in ACDA, FAME and OAKE.

Edward P. Norris III (Nassau Chamber Chorale) is the director of Choral Music at Glen Cove HS where he conducts the Mixed Chorus and the Select Chorale. Mr. Norris also teaches courses in Music Theory, and AP Music Theory. He serves as the music director and conductor of the school's musical productions, advisor of the Tri-M National Music Honors Society, and serves as the district's music team leader. During Mr. Norris' tenure at Glen Cove HS, the Mixed Chorus and Select Chorale have only received Gold Medals and Gold Medals with Distinction at the NYSSMA Major Ensemble festivals. In 2013, the Select Chorale was invited to perform at the White House for the President and First Lady, as well as other invited guests. In January of 2016, Mr. Norris and the Select Chorale performed in a concert tour of Italy, including the distinct honor to perform for His Holiness, Pope Francis, at the Feast of the Epiphany at St. Peters. In the spring of 2019, the Select Chorale had the honor of performing at the Music for All National Choral Festival in Indianapolis, Indiana. In February 2023, Mr. Norris' Select Chorale were featured performers at the ACDA National Conference in Cincinnati Ohio. Mr. Norris is a graduate of the Aaron Copland School of Music at Queens College, where he received both his Bachelor of Arts Degree, and his Master's Degree in Music Education. Mr. Norris is extremely proud to be the director of the Nassau Chamber Chorale, and to have performed some of the world's finest choral literature in stunning performance settings. Louise O'Hanlon (Nassau Senior Treble Choir) has been an educator for the past 36 years. She is proud to have spent 31 of those years in the Herricks School District. Ms. O'Hanlon holds a Bachelor of Music and a Higher Diploma in Education from University College in Cork, Ireland, a Master's Degree in Education from Lehman College (CUNY), and certificates in both Orff (Hofstra University) and Kodály (New York University). Louise has been studying choral conducting at Westminster Choir College in Princeton, New Jersey during the summer months. At Herricks HS, Louise teaches Treble Choir, Chamber Choir, and Mixed Chorus. Under Ms. O'Hanlon's directorship, Herricks Chamber Choir has consistently received ratings of Gold and Gold with Distinction for Level VI performance at NYSSMA. Chamber Choir has performed at the ACDA All Eastern Conference in 2012 and at the NYACDA Conference in October 2016. In March 2018 the Herricks Chamber Choir performed at the inaugural Music for All National Choral Festival in Indianapolis and worked with composer and clinician, Dr. Rollo Dilworth. In December 2023, Herricks Chamber Choir has the honor of being one of only two high school choirs to perform at the NYSSMA Winter Conference. Professionally, Ms. O'Hanlon has been a guest conductor for several All-County festivals in Suffolk County. Ms. O'Hanlon's passion for Global Music has led to reading sessions at Westminster Choir College and a presentation at the Crane School of Music. In the fall of 2017, Ms. O'Hanlon presented Global Music workshops at the Balanced Mind Conference and the NYACDA Conference. At MYO, she loves to expose her students to a wide variety of ethnically diverse music. In addition to choral leadership, Ms. O'Hanlon is also a Health Coach, and a Yoga and Mindfulness teacher to both children and adults.

Dr. Sun Ah Choi (Nassau Treble Choir), a native of South Korea, began studying piano at the age of five and continued her musical studies at the Seoul Arts High School in Seoul. She received her Master of Music degree in piano performance from the Manhattan School of Music, as a student of Marc Silverman. She earned her doctorate degree in classical piano performance at Mason Gross School of Arts, Rutgers, New Jersey State University, as a student of Daniel Epstein. Dr. Choi was the First Prize winner of the Korean Piano Association Competition, and was also awarded Second Prize in the Teenager Competition. In the U.S.A., she was the winner of the Special Presentation Award of the Artists International Competition. In addition, she performed in the Sin Choon Music Concert of the Sejong Cultural Center, the Sin Youn Joo Ja Music Concert of the Seoul Arts Center, and in a concert for the Korean Piano Association at the Ewon Cultural Center and Ewha Womans University. As an active soloist and collaborative pianist, she has performed in many solo and chamber recitals in U.S.A., including her Carnegie Hall recital debut in New York City. She has also performed solo recitals at Greenfield Hall, Baisley Powell Elebash Recital Hall, Schare Hall at Rutgers University, and so on. She has participated in the masterclasses of Lazar Berman, and Yong Hi Moon. In addition to performing, She has taught at Hunter College of City University of New York and worked at Rutgers University as an accompanist. She is currently working as an accompanist at Long Island University (C. W. Post).

Ms. Kim has also participated in several music festivals as a piano soloist and chamber musician such as The International Academy of Music in Italy, Kromeritz Summer Music Festival in Czech Republic, and Puigcerda International Musica Classica Festival in Spain and France. Beyond musicianship skills, Ms. Kim has a passion for teaching. To further her career, she pursued and completed her Master's degree in Music Education from New York University. Ms. Kim's musical studies have extended to organ playing. Currently, Ms. Kim serves as an organist at Korean-American Presbyterian Church in Queens. Jeong-Hwa Park (Nassau Concert Choir) is a highly accomplished pianist, who has been actively teaching and performing as a soloist and chamber musician in South Korea and the United States. She holds a Master of Arts and Doctor of Musical Arts degrees in piano performance from Arizona State University (ASU). Dr. Park has performed at several prestigious venues such as Weill Hall at Carnegie Hall, LeFrak Concert Hall at Queens College, Yamaha Hall in New York City, Old First Concert Series in San Francisco, and the London Piano Festival. Her recent chamber music performance for "Concerts on the Slope" in Brooklyn was broadcast on WWFM The Classical Network. Dr. Park has won numerous awards including a Special Presentation Award from Artists International Presentations, New York; and first prize in The Joseph and Ida Klatzkin Contemporary Solo Keyboard Music Competition and the Arizona State University Piano Concerto Competition resulting in a broadcast of the concerto performance on Arizona public radio, KBAQ. In South Korea, she performed her solo recital at Dajeon Arts and Cultural Center, and a lecture recital at Buam Art Hall in Seoul. She also performed at the College Music Society International Conference in Seoul as a collaborative pianist. As an accompanist, she performed for World Vision Korea Children's Choir and was invited to accompany the National Choir of Korea on tour, resulting in several concerts which were broadcast on Korean national television. Currently, Dr. Park is an adjunct assistant professor at Nassau Community College and serves on the piano faculty at the Eisman Center for Preparatory Studies in Music at Queens College and Brooklyn Conservatory of Music.

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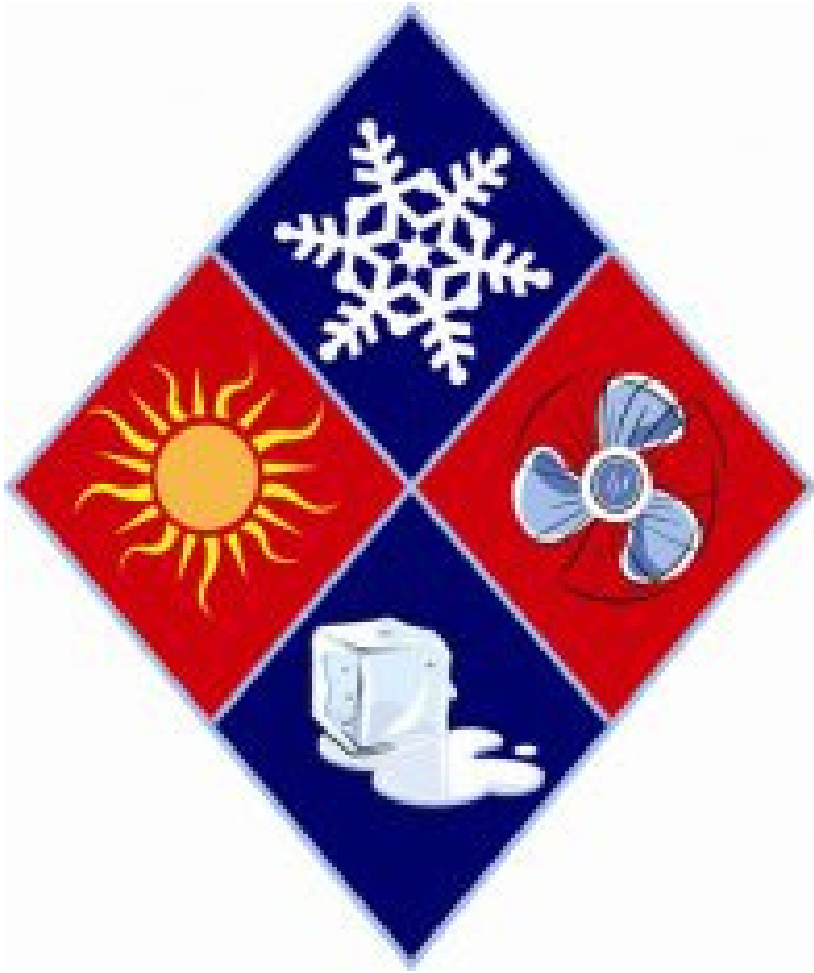
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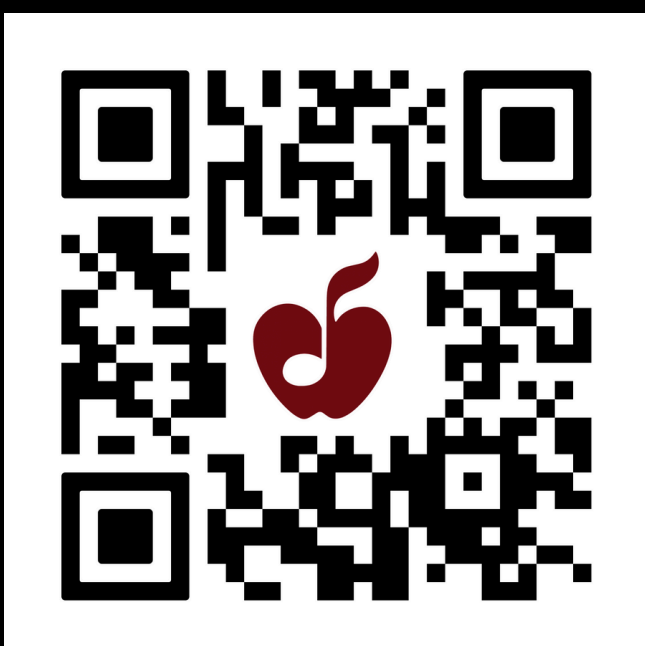
